<b>Course selection</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Provisional course list sent with application documents.</li> <li>✓ Confirmation upon arrival during the orientation days. Course selection is binding and cannot be modified after the first 2 weeks of the semester.</li> </ul>
<b>Course load per semester</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Courses are validated with grades and ECTS credits.</li> <li>✓ Courses generally offer 25 hours of lecture and require 54 or 108 hours of autonomous course work per semester.</li> <li>✓ On average 7 to 8 courses per week (around 20 hours per week) are necessary to validate 30 ECTS in one semester.</li> <li>✓ The course selection depends on the requirements of each home institution.</li> <li>✓ Work-study (alternance) is a possible option for <b>degree-seeking students ONLY</b>.</li> <li>✓ It is not possible to choose courses across different programs.</li> </ul>
